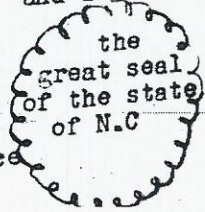


To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting,

Know Ye that we for and in consideration of the sum of fifty shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into our treasury by Henery Fry have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Henery Fry a tract of land containing One hundred and Seventy Seven acres-- lying and being in our County of Rowan on the west side of Abbis creek, at the Colonsls ford a nicory on David Smiths line and runs West twenty seven chains to a stakee said Smiths corner thence South thirty five West three chains to a pine on said Smiths line James Howells corner thence North fifty seven West thirty four chains to a pine Joseph Wafords and said Howells corner thence North thirty three East nineteen and a half chains to a pine on Corod Cornlysons line thence East twenty five chains to a black Gum Said Cornelsons corner to the Creek bank thence along the Meander, of the Creek to the Beginning as by the plat hereunto anexed doth appear together with all woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said land belonging or appertaining To Hold to the said Henery Fry his Heirs and Assigns for ever yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise as our General Assembly from time to time may Direct Provided Always that the said Henery Fry shall cause this grant to be registered in the Registers Office of our said County of Rowan within twelve months from the Date hereof otherwise the same shall be void and of none Effect. In Testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent and our Great Seal to be hereunto affixed. Witness Alexander Martin Esquire our Governor Captain General and Commander in chief at Hillsbro the tenth day of October in the eighth year of our Independence and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hun-
